Your actions within the first 60-90 seconds of an Active Shooter incident may be the difference between saving a Life or experiencing catastrophic loss of life:

- Average incident last 12 minutes while 40% are over in less than 5 minutes
- 56% of armed intruder incidents were still active when law enforcement arrived and deadly forced had to be used.
- 90% involved a “lone shooter” making preventative actions by law enforcement more difficult.

“Active Shooter” drills spark a raft of legal complaints (critics say simulation exercises can traumatize those taking part and receiving the training). If simulation exercises are overwhelming and confusing, then what can we do:

- Training & preparedness have both played a significant role in the prevention of major loss of life
- Armed intruders are engaged in killing or attempting to kill people in a confined and populated area with no pattern or method of selecting their victims
- Our responsibility is to “BE PREPARED” and respond to an incident in an organized manner with the goal of preventing loss of life
- Increased awareness and reporting of pre-incident activities involving criminal perpetrators whose actions are “suspicious” have most likely prevented some shooter situations from happening
- As a result of past shooter incidents, law enforcement has changed their “response” protocols dramatically; to neutralize the shooter before handling any other protective measures
- Even when law enforcement was present or able to respond within minutes, civilians and employees often had to make life or death decisions, therefore pre-training activities were beneficial in the decision making process.
